Visiting Music Peripatetic: Guitar Teacher

To support the work of the music department at Mount St Mary's College and Barlborough Hall School, we are looking for an experienced musician who will be able to work well as part of a forwarding thinking and ambitious musical team in a school which prides itself in its musical traditions.

- To teach classical and electric guitar to pupils aged 5-18 across two difference sites in one-to-one lessons.

- To work as part of a team in planning repertoire for concerts and offering performing opportunities for pupils.
- To contribute to departmental discussions regarding repertoire and events.
- To assist the work of both music departments by dealing with administrative and other matters. This includes overseeing instrumental stock, liaising with the finance office, updating attendance registers and monitoring the music library.
- To assist in the scholarship audition process and prepare suitable candidates for auditions.
- To liaise with the Director of Music about all matters.
